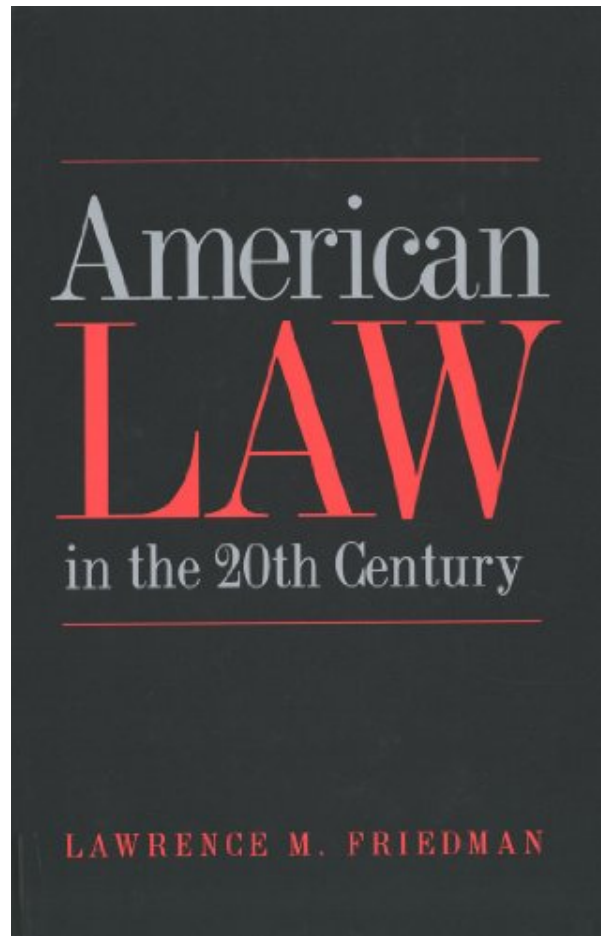
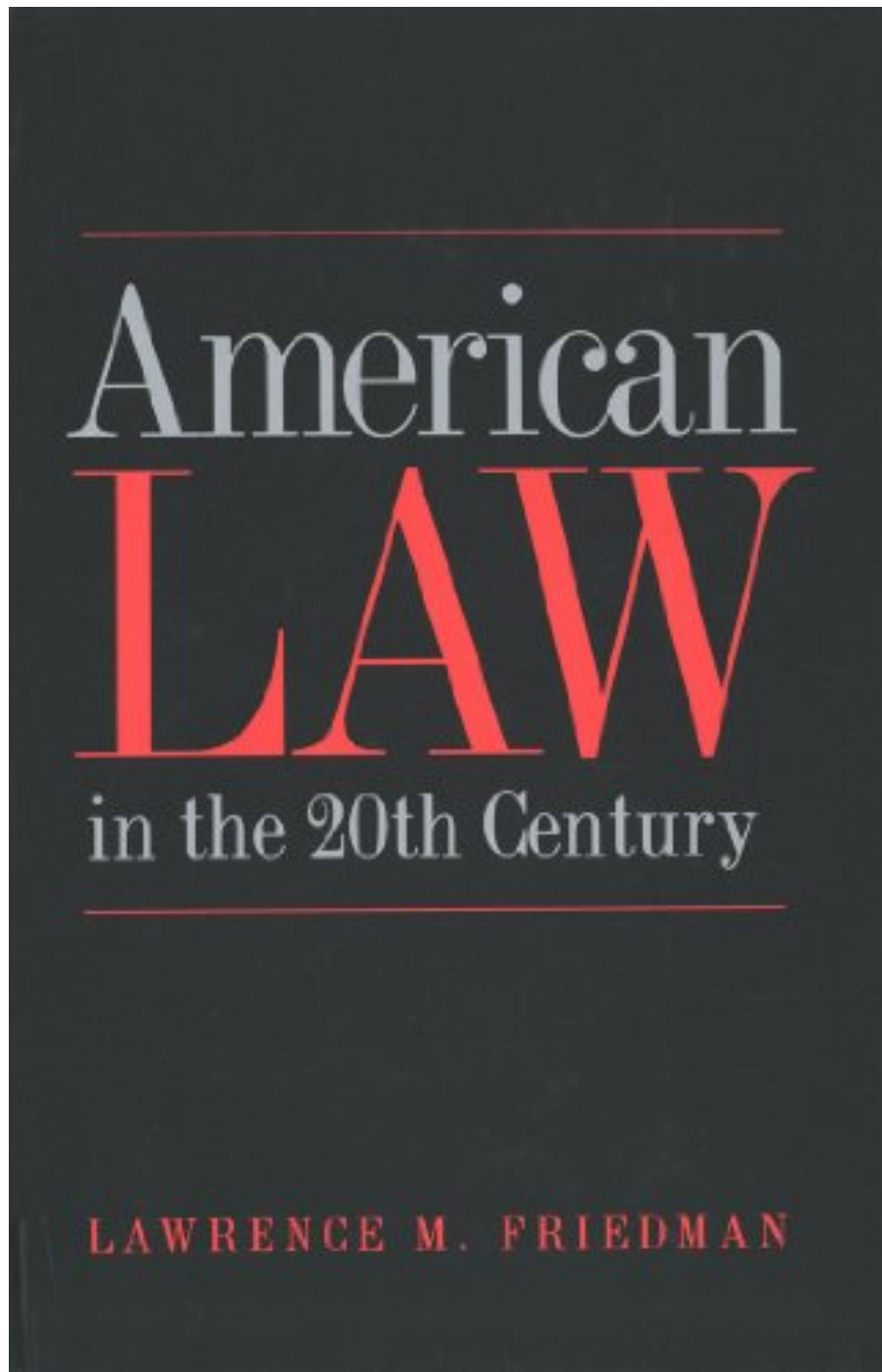

Due to a somewhat nasty review by an Amazon customer - probably some obscure and jealous colleague of Lawrence Friedman's, angry at the writer's success - I hesitated to purchase the book. I have a PhD. in law and a Master's degree from Georgetown law but I still learned a lot and I enjoyed every chapter, paragraph and line. Friedman's erudition and mastery of the subject is obvious. He writes clearly, eloquently and is never boring. His tongue in cheek systematic use of the feminine is pleasantly ironic. He keeps referring to a hypothetical lawyer as "she" instead of the politically correct and tedious "he or she".

From the point of view of a civil law lawyer (or indeed anyone wanting to learn more about the American legal system) this book is compulsory reading. Friedman's assumption that laws are shaped by society and its changes may be discussed and some of his views one may or may not agree with. But that is irrelevant, because here are 607 seven pages of superb quality and interest. ...
